## Statement on Republican Study Committee FY24 Budget

This statement on the House Republican Study Committee's fiscal year 2024 budget proposal may be attributed to James Edwards, Executive Director, <u>Conservatives for Property Rights</u>:

"The Republican Study Committee's FY24 budget is designed with many sound budgetary and fiscal measures. Importantly, it addresses several priorities of Conservatives for Property Rights.
